We thank you for your patience and support as we continue to adjust to this period of unprecedented change and uncertainty. Support for students and families

Deployment of Technology

Beginning this week, we will be deploying technology to those families in greatest need of devices. As you can imagine this is a big endeavour so this may take the better part of the couple of weeks.

Hours of Recommended Student Work

Hours of work as outlined by the Ministry of Education, including instruction, online meetings, and independent work.

- Kindergarten to Grade 6: minimum 5 hours per week
- Grade 7-8: minimum 10 hours per week
- Grade 9-12: minimum 3 hours per course per week

Assessment and Evaluation

a) Elementary Students (K-8):

Teachers will use assessment for learning (formative assessment) to gather evidence of how students are progressing and provide feedback to their students to support their continuous and ongoing learning.

In determining final grades and marks for the final report card, teachers will use the evaluation information gathered before March 13th. Reporting on Learning Skills and Work Habits should also reflect information gathered prior to March 13th. Teachers may also include comments on the final report card if they feel that doing so would support the student's progress.

The Kindergarten Communication of Learning will be based on teachers' observations of key learning and growth in learning prior to March 13th. Teachers may also choose to include comments on growth in learning demonstrated during the school closure period.

Final report cards will be provided for all elementary students.

b) Secondary Students (9-12):

All secondary students will receive final report card marks. Teachers will assign learning tasks, projects and culminating activities and will provide students with feedback on their learning. Teachers will base the final mark on work completed up to March 13th, as well as work done through distance learning however they can adjust the weighting of assigned tasks in the determination of the final mark. Reporting on Learning Skills and Work Habits will reflect information gathered prior to March 13th. Teachers may also include comments on the final report card.

Civics and Citizenship and Career Studies Half-Credit Courses

For students enrolled in Civics and Citizenship and Career Studies half-credit courses in the second semester, their final mark for the half-credit course underway at the time of school closures will be based on work completed as of March 13th. Teachers can provide student opportunities to complete work not yet submitted as part of their final mark.

On Monday April 6th, students can begin work on the other half-credit course.

Graduating students

Mid-term marks will be calculated for graduating students for the college and university admission process. Teachers will use evidence of learning that reflects work completed prior to the school closure. They may also provide opportunities for students to submit a missed and/or additional assignment to demonstrate their learning within the timelines prescribed by the teacher. Teachers can adjust the weighting of assigned tasks in their determination of a mark, if needed. Marks should represent the most accurate reflection of student work, based on what is reasonable and in the best interest of students during this time. Marks will be submitted between April 23 and May 1st.

Volunteer hours

The graduation requirement to complete 40 hours of community involvement is suspended for this school year for graduating students.

As always, students and families should connect with their educators if they have questions about assessment and evaluation.
